

Dangerous Sexual Offense - convictions occurring after June 30, 2006

Any criminal offense under title 16 as specified in this paragraph or any offense under federal law or the laws of another state or territory of the United States which consists of the same or similar elements of the following offenses:

- A Aggravated assault with the intent to rape in violation of 16-5-2;
- B Kidnapping in violation of 16-5-40 which involves a victim who is less than 14 yoa, except by a parent;
- C False imprisonment in violation of 16-5-41 which involves a victim who is less than 14 yoa, except by a parent;
- D Rape in violation of 16-6-1;
- E Sodomy in violation of 16-6-2;
- F Aggravated sodomy in violation of 16-6-2;
- G Statutory rape in violation of 16-6-3, if the individual convicted of the offense is 21 yoa or older;
- H Child molestation in violation of 16-6-4;
- I Aggravated child molestation in violation of 16-6-4, unless the person was convicted of a misdemeanor offense;
- J Enticing a child for indecent purposes in violation of 16-6-5;
- K Sexual assault against persons in custody in violation of 16-6-5.1;
- L Incest in violation of 16-6-22;
- M A second conviction for sexual battery in violation of 16-6-23;
- N Sexual exploitation of children in violation of 16-12-100;
- O Electronically furnishing obscene materials to minors in violation of 16-12-100.1;
- P Computer pornography and child exploitation prevention in violation of 16-12-100.2;

If subject is convicted of a dangerous sexual offense, as listed above, on or after June 30, 2006, the offender must pay \$250 upon each annual registration.

- * For the purposes of this paragraph, conduct which is punished as for a misdemeanor or which is prosecuted in juvenile court shall not be considered a dangerous sexual offense.

Criminal offense against a victim who is a minor: Convictions occurring on or before June 30, 2001, which consists of:

1. Kidnapping of a minor, except by a parent;
2. False imprisonment of a minor, except by a parent;
3. Criminal sexual conduct toward a minor;
4. Solicitation of a minor to practice prostitution; or
5. Any conviction resulting from an underlying sexual offense against a victim who is a minor.

Criminal offense against a victim who is a minor: Convictions occurring after June 30, 2001, which consists of:

1. Kidnapping of a minor, except by a parent;
2. False imprisonment of a minor, except by a parent;
3. Criminal sexual conduct toward a minor;
4. Solicitation of a minor to engage in sexual conduct;
5. Use of a minor to practice prostitution;
6. Use of a minor to engage in any sexually explicit conduct to produce any visual medium depicting such conduct;
7. Creating, publishing, selling, distributing, or possessing any material depicting a minor or a portion of a minors body engaged in sexually explicit conduct;
8. Transmitting, making, selling, buying, or disseminating by means of a computer any descriptive or identifying information regarding a child for the purpose of offering or soliciting sexual conduct of or with a child or the visual depicting of such conduct;
9. Conspiracy to transport, ship, receive, or distribute visual depictions of minors engaged in sexually explicit conduct; or
10. Any conduct which, by its nature, is a sexual offense against a minor.

* **For the purposes of above, conduct which is punished as for a misdemeanor or which is prosecuted in juvenile court shall not be considered a criminal offense against a victim who is a minor.**

Information Required To Register

1. Name, social security number, age, race, sex, date of birth, height, weight, hair color, eye color, fingerprints and photograph;
2. Address of any permanent residence and address of any current temporary residence, within the state or out of state, and if applicable in addition to the address a rural route address and a post office box;
3. If the place of residence is a motor vehicle or trailer provide the vehicle identification number, the license tag number and a description including color scheme of the motor vehicle or trailer;
4. If the place of residence is a mobile home provide the mobile home location permit number, the name and address of the owner of the home, a description including the color scheme of the manufactured home and if applicable a description of where the manufactured home is located on the property;
5. If the place of residence is a vessel, live-aboard vessel, or houseboat, provide the hull identification number, the manufactures serial number, the name of the vessel, the registration number and a description including color scheme of the vessel, live aboard vessel, or houseboat;
6. Date of employment, place of employment and address of employer;
7. Place of vocation and address of the place of vocation;
8. Vehicle make, model, color, and license tag number;
9. If enrolled, employed, or carrying on a vocation at an institution of higher education in this state, the name, address, and county of each institution, including each campus attended and enrollment or employment status; and,
10. Name of the crime or crimes for which the sexual offender is registering and the date released from prison or placed on probation or parole, or supervised release;
11. Level risk assessment classification.
12. You must be fingerprinted and photographed at each annual registration.

If any of the above information changes you must report, in person within 72 hours of the change, to the McDuffie County Sheriff's Office to have the change or changes recorded in writing. You have not registered if you fail to provide any information as stated or required as outlined above. Failing to register will result in a warrant being issued for your arrest.

Your annual registration is due within 72 hours of your birth date.

If you are required to register then you may not live, work and or loiter within 1000 feet of the following locations: Locations are measured from property lines.

1. Any child care facility;
2. Any church;
3. Any school;
4. Any areas where minors congregate to include;
 - A. All public and private parks;
 - B. Recreation facilities;
 - C. Playgrounds;
 - D. Skating rinks;
 - E. Neighborhood centers;
 - F. Gymnasiums;
 - G. *School bus stops (A Federal Court Order is in effect stopping this provision from being enforced)*
 - H. Public and private swimming pools.

You cannot be employed by any childcare facility, school, or church, or by any business or entity that is located within 1000 feet of such.

Located within 1000 feet of an area where minors congregate includes eating establishments with playgrounds.

I certify that the McDuffie County Sheriff's Office has provided and explained to me three pages of instruction and direction concerning my responsibilities concerning registration requirements', and also living, working and loitering restrictions'. I understand it is my responsibility to conform to the laws, rules and guidelines that govern my actions while being required to register on the sex offender registry.

Furthermore, I understand that failure to follow the laws, rules and guidelines will result in a criminal arrest warrant being issued for my arrest.

Area where minors congregate shall include:

All public and private parks and recreation facilities, playgrounds, skating rinks, neighborhood centers, gymnasiums, school bus stops and public and community pools.

Childcare facility means:

All public and private pre-kindergarten facilities, day-care centers, childcare centers, preschool facilities, and long term care facilities for children.

Church means:

A place of public religious worship.

Level 1 risk assessment classification means the sexual offender is a low sex offense and low recidivism risk for future sexual offenses.

Level 2 risk assessment classification means the sexual offender is an intermediate sex offense risk and intermediate recidivism risk for future sexual offenses and includes all sexual offenders who do not meet the criteria for classification either as a sexually dangerous predator or for Level 1 risk assessment.

Minor means any individual under the age of 18 years and any individual that the sexual offender believed at the time of the offense was under the age of 18 years if such individual was the victim of an offense.

Public and community swimming pools includes municipal, school, hotel, motel, or any pool to which access is granted in exchange for payment of a daily fee. The term includes apartment complex pools, country club pools, or subdivision pools which are open to residents of the subdivision and their guests. This term does not include a private pool or hot tub serving single-family dwelling and used only by the residents of the dwelling and their guests.

School bus stop means:

A school bus stop as designated by local school boards of education or private schools.

School means:

All public and private and private kindergarten, elementary and secondary schools.

Sexually dangerous predator means a sexual offender:

- A. Who was designated as a sexually violent predator between July 1, 1996 and June 30, 2006: or,
- B. Who is determined by the Sexual Offender Registration Review Board to be at risk of perpetrating any future dangerous sexual offenses.

Vocation means:

Any sort of full time, part time, or volunteer employment with or without compensation exceeding 14 consecutive days or for an aggregate period of time exceeding 30 days during any calendar year.

Information Required to be Posted in Certain Locations in County

- a. Name;
- b. Address;
- c. Age;
- d. Physical description;
- e. Crime of conviction;
- f. Conviction date;
- g. Jurisdiction of conviction;
- h. Photograph;
- i. Risk assessment classification level;
- j. Explanation of how the board classifies sexual offenders and sexually dangerous predators.

The information listed above shall be posted in the following locations:

- 1. Sheriff's Office;
- 2. Any county administrative building;
- 3. Main building of any municipal cooperation;
- 4. Clerk of superior court;
- 5. Website maintained by the sheriff.
